34. How does the department ensure that programme objectives are constantly met and learning outcomes monitored?

- a) **Tutorial system** is effectively carried out; Tutors concerned are constantly in touch with students regarding their progress and provide solutions to their problems. Feedback from students is a key source of assessing the understanding capacity of the students and hence the programme objectives and learning outcomes are monitored constantly. Home works are assigned for statistics and the mathematics and corrected. Suggestions made at the college council, which meet periodically, are carried out systematically.
